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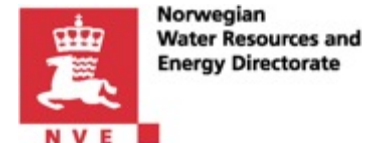

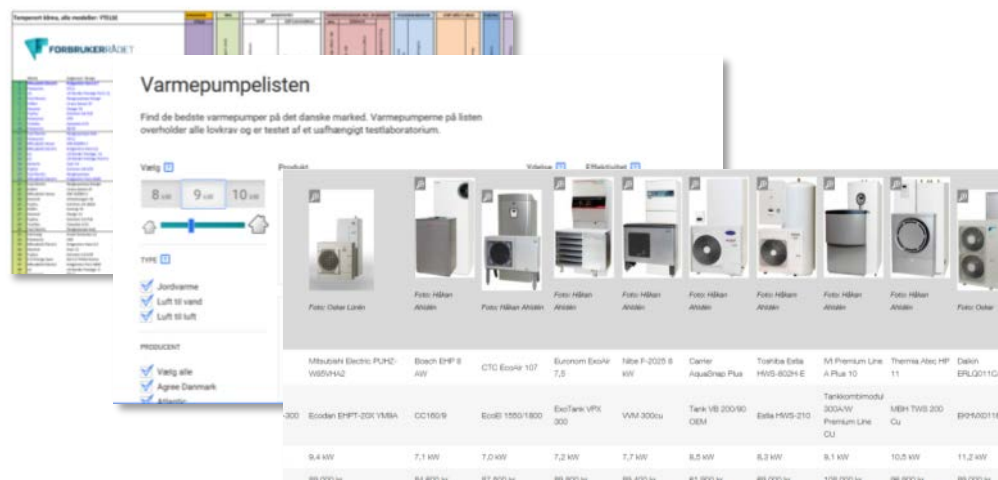


- National authority for energy policy issues

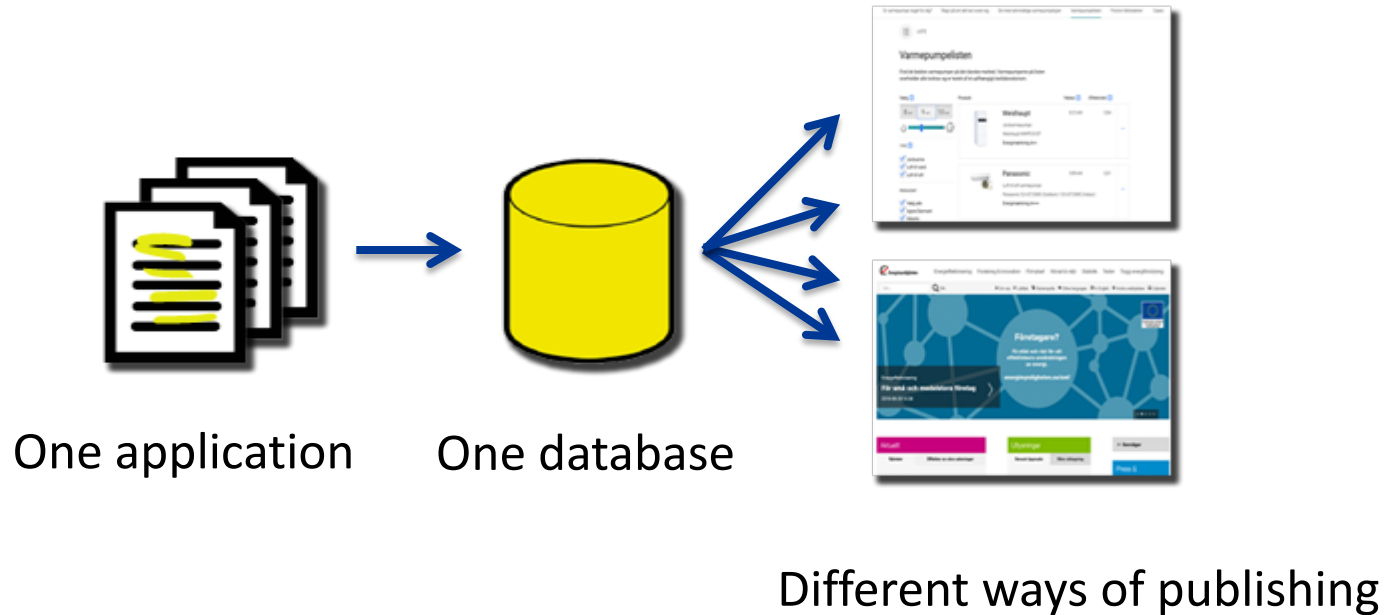
Background

- Possibilities of a more uniform market surveillance
- More cost efficient with one common solution
- Easier to advertise an efficient heat pump in different markets
- Closer cooperation between Nordic countries on a strategic product group

Plan forward

- Preliminary time frame
 - Decision on which countries want to move forward: Sep-Oct 2016
 - Developing the Danish list into a Nordic one: Nov 2016 – summer 2017
 - Rollout on other national websites: end of 2017
